



## Black Lives Matter

We're thinking about how this affects our community and the area that we live in. We started this newsletter wanting to hear from people in the area on all things big and small, and while we usually like leading with the lols, that isn't where we're at this week.

There's a bit of a Scottish myth that we're not as complicit in colonialism and racism as England or the US. Jock Tamson's bairns and aw that. In fact, Scottish people owned more slaves, more plantations, and owned a higher percentage of tobacco and sugar plantations than England and most other European countries.

In St Andrew's Square, not far from where you've picked this up, stands a monument to Henry Dundas, the man who delayed the abolition of the slave trade by 15 years. He and his family built and owned many of the buildings you can still see in St Andrews Square, with money that came almost entirely from plantations. There's not only a statue of him on a massive column in the centre of the city, but also one of the city's central streets is named after him. Bute House (where Nicola Sturgeon lives) was the property of slave owners, and most of New Town was built on money generated by the slavery of Black people. By extension, given its wealth, that means most of Edinburgh too.

This is not 'just' ancient history. The parallels with the USA are clear. Five years ago in Kirkcaldy, nine police officers restrained Sheku Bayoh, a black man, with CS spray and batons, and killed him. Not before days of riots and rage, George Floyd's killer is being charged with 2nd degree murder and the three other cops are being charged with aiding and abetting. Here in not-racist Scotland, nobody will face criminal charges. It's our complacency that lets these things get swept under the carpet.

In her recent article for *The National* on the 7th June, Tomiwa Folorunso said:

'History can easily explain why we should not be shocked, because what is happening is not new, it is not an isolated incident or an American problem. It is the past, present and future. I do not think we need history to tell us why we should feel sad, and angry and outraged and scared. We do not need another murder to feel those things.'

We won't change that future by ignoring the violence. We won't change it either by putting on another collective performance of 'reflection', to be retired once more until the next murder. We will change it by speaking up now, and continuing to speak up and fight racism each day, whether current affairs move us or not, and by building neighbourhood safety from within, through solidarity with our neighbours.
